



Pike County Health Coalition Meeting Minutes

Monday February 11, 2019

At Pike County Senior Center in Waverly

The meeting was called to order at 3:05 p.m. by Nichole Smith, Accreditation Coordinator of the Pike County General Health District. Mrs. Smith welcomed everyone. The sign-in for the meeting indicated sixteen (16) in attendance.

Mrs. Smith started the meeting with introductions and a brief update from the previous coalition meeting.

Vision Feedback & Formulate Vision

Nichole Smith stated that Kim Jones would lead the meeting forward into the information being covered on the CHA data. Kim reiterated the MAPP process and how that was developed from the CDC. She stated that this is an evidence based process to demonstrate effectiveness in terms of planning and assessment to alleviate more plans and to be successful. She stated that we did an exercise at the last meeting and put out an online survey for the attendees who were not able to attend. She was to take the feedback from the questions enter into a system of word clouds from the responses.

The results were passed around the table at the meeting. Kim had consolidated those word clouds from the questions from the online survey to create a sentence to formulate a vision test statement. The two (2) tests statements that were formulated were as followed:

- An engaged community with equitable resources to live healthy lives.
- A community where everyone has knowledge of and access to health and wellness resources.

Tammy Jones said that she liked the second statement and that it is something that she hears regularly from a lot of the community members. Frank Klobuchar states that he felt that it should've fit all the organizations and that being a minister that he was wondering if that would fit him and his faith based organizations. He asked if "wellness" would signify that for his organization. Kim answered that it could as generally rounded idea. Frank also didn't know if "community" would be the word used in terms of it fitting the entire county. Sean Stilner stated that maybe "region" would be a better fit for the word that should be used in the vision statement than community. He stated the following as a possible test vision statement to be used such as "a team oriented organization that is going to lead in the obtaining of resources and developing of programs to educate, promote, and improve health and wellness within the region." Kim suggested that we revisit the formulated vision statements at the next meeting with the majority voting on the second statement moving forward.

Values Statement

Next, Kim stated that she was going to put everyone on the spot for this exercise. She went to each attendee around the group and asked each one of them, “why they attended the coalition meetings and what you feel is an important value to the community?” The list that was formulated through this process was as followed:

These all come together to formulate several reoccurring ideas around the community such as respect, trust, inclusiveness, engagement, and communication. These are the values that will continue to identify the core of the Pike County Health Coalition moving forward.

Data Collection Factors

Nichole Smith handed out a data collection points that were addressed by the coalition members for the next community health assessment process for the group to discuss. Kim Jones stated that these were the data points that they used the last time that their assessment was completed for Adena Regional Medical Center. The attendees looked over the information and a few more items were added that were not mentioned on the list that needed to be added such as:

- Cervical cancer
- Homelessness
- Recreational/Medicinal Marijuana Use
- Hep C
- Overdose rates
- Foster care from opioid/drug use

Sean Stilner added that it may be better to do this at a regional effort than something that would be focused only at the county level. Kim stated that it needed to be county specific to be accurate to what would represent Pike County area. Sean stated that more funding opportunities may or could be available if it would be done at a regional level. Kim re-stated that it had to be county specific. The group agreed on the following data collection points and decided that to pursue anything else would be too time consuming.

Partner Updates

After these meeting agenda items were completed, Nichole Smith asked if there was any partner updates that anyone had to add to the meeting. Andrea Crabtree stated that the Pike County Job &

Family Services were going to be having an event for Pike County Outreach. They would be holding a lunch and a Chinese auction. This would help the food pantry to continue the efforts of the county to have meals for the homeless individuals. Any monetary donations are needed to provide more meals to the community.

Next Meeting

Nichole adjourned the meeting at 3:50. Members encouraged a set date for the next meeting. The group decided on the next meeting date to be set for the Pike County Health Coalition was March 11, 2019 @ 3:00 at the Pike County Senior Center.
